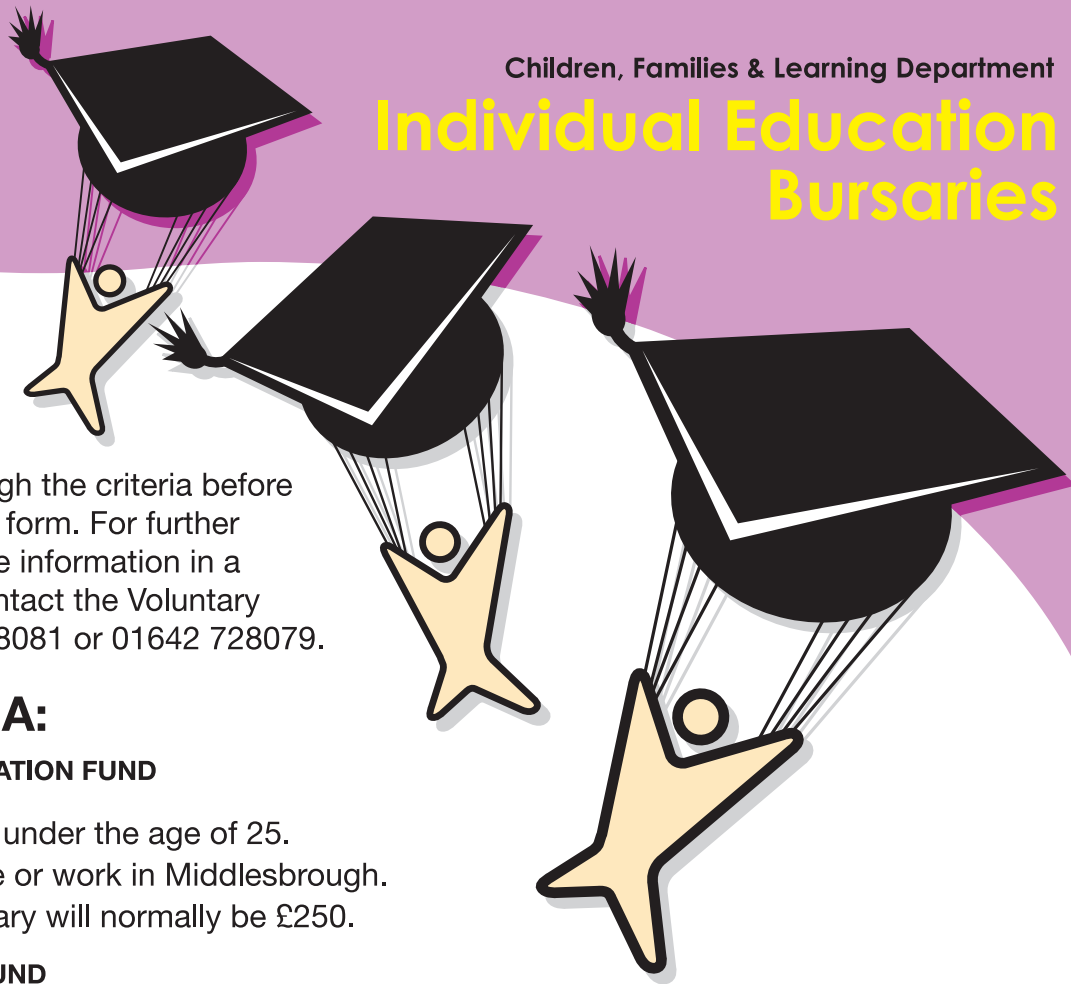


Individual Education Bursaries

MAIN CRITERIA:

MIDDLESBROUGH EDUCATION FUND

- Applicants must be under the age of 25.
- Applicants must live or work in Middlesbrough.
- The maximum bursary will normally be £250.

TEESSIDE EDUCATION FUND

- Applicants must be under the age of 25.
- Applicants must live or work in the former County Borough of Teesside.
- The maximum bursary will normally be £250.

THE CAPTAIN JOHN VIVIAN NANCARROW FUND

- Applicants must live in Middlesbrough.
- The maximum bursary will normally be £250.

A scheme approved by the Secretary of State for Education provides for Middlesbrough Council to administer a fund established under the will of the late George Bennett Nancarrow to provide awards and scholarships in memory of his son Captain John Vivian Nancarrow for the following purposes:

- (a) Courses of study at any school, college or university approved by the Council (*minimum period one year, renewable annually subject to satisfactory progress reports*).
- (b) The purchase of clothing, equipment or books to help beneficiaries to prepare for, or enter, a trade or profession.
- (c) Educational travel scholarship, with the provision of facilities for recreation, sport and social and physical training for pupils and students.
- (d) The study of Music or other Arts.
- (e) Educational research (*including the publication of results*)*.
- (f) Assistance in the event of sickness, disability, special stress or necessity, or unexpected loss where no assistance is provided from another source and where it is reasonably necessary to enable beneficiaries to derive full benefit from the educational facilities.

These awards and scholarships are open to persons of either gender who have not attained the age of 25 and who are or have been at any time in attendance at the following schools or colleges:

Acklam Grange (previously Oakland or Stainsby Schools)

Brackenhoe/Kings Academy (previously Brookside or Bertram Ramsey Schools)

Hall Garth (previously Hustler or Boynton Schools)

Kings Manor

Langbaugh/Keldholme/Unity City Academy (previously Springfield or Southlands Schools)

Middlesbrough College

Teesside Tertiary College

In case of (e), assistance may also be provided to persons over 25 years of age*

Applications will only be considered if they have the following supporting information enclosed with their completed application form:

- Written confirmation from tutor.
- The section on the application form regarding confirmation of attendance at the stated college/university is signed and stamped.
- Official documentation confirming your attendance/place at university/college/school.
- Written estimates of cost and if applicable, any other additional information to confirm the purpose of grant aid.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Individuals will not normally receive more than one grant in a single financial year.
2. Greater consideration will be given to those who have not received a grant from Middlesbrough Council in the previous financial year.
3. Monies must normally be spent within 3 months of receipt of the grant. Permission must be sought to extend this period. Any monies not spent must be returned to Middlesbrough Council.
4. Receipts or proof of expenditure must be produced within 3 months of receipt of the grant. *(N.B. Failure to do so could result in recovery of the grant).*
